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ADVISORY COMMITTEES TO THE BOARD

The Board welcomes the advice and counsel of citizens in the planning and operation of the schools.

Advisory committees may be organized by the Board to help seek solutions to specific problems confronting the district, interpret educational needs to the community or provide an interchange of ideas and information between school officials and members of the community. Public support is imperative in dealing with such problems as building needs, tax rates or new courses of instruction. Advisory committees can contribute to a two-way flow of information between the Board and the public.

All advisory committees shall be established by the Board to advise, investigate and/or report to the Board on specific matters. The Board reserves the right to accept or reject proposals or recommendations of advisory committees.

When the specific task of an advisory committee is completed, the committee shall be disbanded.

Advisory committees shall comply with the state's open meetings law.
